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why predisaster mitigation?

The purpose of the Strategy Document is to propose mitigation strategies that reduce:

- the loss of life and property
- human suffering
- economic disruption
- disaster assistance costs resulting from natural disasters

In 2005, the eight municipalities of South Western Connecticut put together the Region's first multi-jurisdictional Predisaster Mitigation Plan. The PDM was approved by FEMA on July 17, 2005 and covered the municipalities of Darien, Greenwich, New Canaan, Norwalk, Stamford, Weston, Westport, and Wilton.

The *Predisaster Mitigation Strategy Document* is an update to the original plan adopted by the region's municipalities in 2005.



the pdm process

Municipalities have a variety of formal and informal hazard mitigation strategies in place. For example, zoning, subdivision and other land-use regulations often require structures to be raised in flood zones.
