RE: State Matching Grant Program (MGP) for Elderly and Demand Response Transportation

Overview: CTDOT has announced a new application process for the MGP, which provides matching funds for transportation of seniors and persons with disabilities to each municipality. Funding is calculated based on the land area and population of those over age 60. The program has been in place since 2006.

The funds cannot replace municipal funding for transportation services. If a town or city reduces its funding for senior/disabled transportation, the grant will be proportionally reduced.

Required Materials: applications are no longer required to access funds for this program. Municipalities need only submit the required certifications and budget information as follows:

- <u>Maintenance of Effort Certification</u>: should be completed and signed by the CFO. Please also include a copy of the budget page for FY 18 that shows the line item for this transportation program.
- <u>Assignability Certification</u>: Those municipalities participating in a coordinated program through a transit district (NTD or HARTransit) should complete this form and have it signed by the municipal CEO assigning the grant to the transit district.
- **Program Budget**: The state will be requesting a program budget submission for FY18 as well, but has not released the required format yet.

CTDOT will be asking for complete submissions of certifications and budgets within a month of when they release the budget detail requirements deadline TBD.

Although the budget page is not yet available, it is recommended that the grant program and sign off for the MGP certifications be placed on the agenda for the next meeting of your municipal boards so that applications are not delayed.

The process starts with an analysis of the higher level limited access roadways, with data presented for I-84 and Route 7. An Executive Briefing for each corridor was distributed, then summarized in a PowerPoint presentation.

Funding commitments and opportunities to reduce congestion were summarized. Plans were outlined for future use of CMP analytic tools to promote additional investments. A short question and answer period followed.

CALL TO ORDER

SWRMPO Chairman Jayme Stevenson called the meeting to order at 11:30 am.

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PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Jim Marpe introduced Patricia Cimarosa and Martin Fox of the Westport Transit District and Westport Town Meeting Transit Committee Member John Suggs, noting their role as advocates for improving public transit services in Westport. The Chairman introduced new staff member Kristin Floberg, who was welcomed by the Council.

CONGESTION MANAGEMENT PROCESS

Kristin Hadjstylianos and Michael Sullivan then made a PowerPoint presentation on their progress in preparing a federally required Congestion Management Process for the region (CMP). The CMP uses analytical tools to define and identify congestion within the two MPO areas. The point is to have a modern data set meeting federal standards, upon which the transportation planning process can prioritize strategies to address congestion, they said.

The process starts with an analysis of the higher level limited access roadways, with data presented for I-95, Route 7 and the Merritt Parkway. An Executive Briefing for each corridor was distributed, then summarized in a PowerPoint presentation.

Funding commitments and opportunities to reduce congestion were summarized. Plans were outlined for future use of CMP analytic tools to promote additional investments. A short question and answer period followed.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

FTA Section 5310 Grant Solicitation: Richard Schreiner reviewed the current Federal Transit Administration 5310 Grant Program solicitation, referring to an agenda attachment dated 2/28/2017 and entitled "Section 5310 Grant Program." Nine applicants have expressed interest thus far, he said.

ACTION ITEMS

Approval of 2/23/2017 Meeting Minutes: After review and on a motion made by Jim Marpe and seconded by Nina Daniel, the minutes of the meeting of 2/23/2017 were unanimously approved, with Laoise King abstaining.

TIP Amendments Notated as SWRTIP #Am2017-003: As requested by Jayme Stevenson, Rob Sachnin reviewed two CTDOT requested Transportation Improvement Program amendments. These were attached to the agenda as a memo entitled "SWRMPO FFY2015-2018 TIP" and summarized by him as follows:

1. CTDOT Project #173-472 to improve signs along the Merritt Parkway. Originally endorsed by SWRMPO in January of 2016, now returned to the MPO as the federal funding share has increased, the proposed update would include the installation, replacement and relocation of variable message signs (VMS) in Greenwich, Norwalk and Westport.

Mr. Sachnin noted that the current VMS on the Merritt Parkway was installed in 1993 and has exceeded its useful life. He also stated that the upgrade is supported by the Merritt Parkway Advisory Committee.

Specific location in Greenwich: replacement northbound near the Riversville Road Bridge. Norwalk locations: relocation northbound near Exit 38, new location northbound near Exit 41, and new location on Route 7 southbound near the Merritt Parkway interchange. Westport: southbound replacement near Exit 41. CT DOT proposes to utilize funds from the federal NHPP Category at \$5,500,000, 100% federal for construction to be programmed in federal fiscal year 2017, he said.

2. CTDOT Project #158-215 will undertake safety and operational improvements at three intersections on Route 1 in Westport. There are elevated accident rates at the three Route 1 intersections to be upgraded, which are Fresh Market Driveway near Rayfield Road, the intersection of Roseville Road and Hillspoint Road, and Bulkley Avenue North and South intersections.

Proposed improvements include the addition of left turn lanes, upgrades to traffic signal equipment, and the addition of new curbs and sidewalks. CT DOT proposes to utilize funds from the federal STPB Category at \$250,000, split as 80% federal and 20% state for a preliminary design phase, the funds to be programmed in federal fiscal year 2017, he said.

Jim Marpe stated that the high accident rates at these locations are well known, include a pedestrian fatality, and that the Town of Westport is supportive of the proposed improvements. Discussion continued after which on a motion made by Jim Marpe and seconded by Laoise King, SWRMPO voted unanimously to endorse the two TIP amendments presented using attached Resolution #2017-003.

ADJOURNMENT

Chairman Jayme Stevenson stated that the next MPO meeting will be held at 11:30 am before the WestCOG meeting scheduled for 4/20/2017 at the Ridgefield Visiting Nurse Association in Ridgefield. Then on a motion duly made and seconded it was voted unanimously to adjourn the meeting at 11:55 am.





HVMPO FFY 2015-2018 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

MPO Action Requested: Review and consider TIP amendment endorsement.

Background: The FFY2015-2018 Housatonic Valley TIP was endorsed by the MPO on October 23, 2014. The TIP was incorporated into the larger Statewide TIP, which was approved by USDOT and EPA on January 21, 2015.

Amendments (HVTIP #Am2017-003):

<u>0034-0309: Newtown Road (State Route 806) widening at Old Shelter Rock Road:</u> The project involves the addition of left turn lanes and the addition of a traffic signal on Newtown Road (SR 806) at Old Shelter Rock Road in Danbury.

Motorists attempting to turn onto Route 806 from Old Shelter Rock Road often experience long delays, especially when turning left. This project adds a traffic signal to the intersection and dedicated left turn lanes onto both Route 806 and Old Shelter Rock Road. In addition to signalization and road widening efforts, the Old Shelter Rock Road approach to Route 806 would be realigned. These improvements would increase sightlines and cut down on rear-end collisions, which are common at this intersection.

The HVMPO studied this location in 2011 as part of the "Transportation Management Plan for Newtown Road in Danbury" and it was also endorsed as part of the "2015 Regional Transportation Plan."

The CTDOT requested TIP amendment involves moving project construction funding from federal to state funding. Written correspondence with CTDOT indicates sufficient state funding is available, as these monies utilize state bond funds, which have already been allocated by the bond commission.

0034-0345: Route 37 northbound lane widening at Barnum Road:

This project was originally endorsed by the HVMPO in October 2014 and involves widening both the Route 37 northbound and Barnum Road southbound shoulders, to allow traffic the opportunity to pass vehicles waiting to make a left turn.

The widening of these two shoulders will reduce the delays motorists often experience while waiting for vehicles to turn left. Additionally, the sidewalk fronting the Stetson Place property will be extended north to the Intersection at Barnum Road. This improvement aligns with the city of Danbury's long term plan to provide a pedestrian connection along this corridor.

The CTDOT requested TIP amendment involves increasing the federal share of funds for the construction phase of the project, consistent with previous discussions between CTDOT and region.
