CALL TO ORDER/ PUBLIC COMMENT

The meeting was called to order at 11:03am by Senior Planner Kristin Hadjstylianos. There were no public comments made.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

WestCOG Data Workshop: WestCOG Deputy Director Michael Towle presented a Data Workshop assessment targeted for Public Works Department Data Needs. He asked each TAG member to complete the questions regarding data needs in each municipality. The data was collected and will be summarized and shared at a future TAG meeting.

Municipal Fee Service: WestCOG Deputy Director Michael Towle gave an update on the Fee Study conducted by WestCOG.

Regional Plan of Conservation and Development: WestCOG Senior Planner Kristin Hadjstylianos gave an update on two Public Information Meetings scheduled to review the WestCOG Plan of Conservation and Development. The meetings will be held Dec. 4th at the Greenwich Audubon and Dec. 5th at Highstead in Redding.

2020 Safety Targets: WestCOG Planner Nicole Sullivan gave an update on the annual safety performance targets, which were presented at the October TAG meeting. WestCOG has collected additional data to assist in understanding the safety targets. The MPO's have until February 27, 2020 to accept the state targets or develop MPO specific targets.

2020 TAG Meeting Schedule: WestCOG Senior Planner Kristin Hadjstylianos shared the proposed 2020 TAG Meeting schedule. It will be approved at the December TAG Meeting.

On-Call Consultants for LOTCIP: WestCOG Senior Project Manager Kevin Mahoney asked attendees if a WestCOG-solicited list of On-Call (i.e., Task-based) design and construction administration consultants would be helpful in advancing LOTCIP projects. Several municipalities expressed an interest this solicitation/list and offered suggestions.

ACTION ITEMS

Approval of 10/8/2019 Minutes: After review and on a motion made by Brookfield Project Manager Greg Dembowski and seconded by Greenwich Deputy Commissioner James Michael, the minutes of the October 8th meeting were unanimously approved.

Over-Programming LOTCIP Funds: Senior Project Manager Kevin Mahoney presented information on the status and progress of COG committed LOTCIP projects. After a review, a motion was made by Brookfield Project Manager Greg Dembowski and seconded by Brookfield Director of Public Works Ralph Tedesco to schedule time at the December TAG meeting to review all projects that have not yet received a CTDOT Commitment to Fund letter and consider recommending that the COG suspend or rescind its LOTCIP funding commitment for projects that are not making reasonable progress. The motion was approved by TAG members, with one opposed (Norwalk Assistant Principal Engineer Michael Yeosock).

LOTCIP Adjustment: Senior Project Manager Kevin Mahoney presented a requested adjustment to the COG's LOTCIP project commitments. The adjustment will result in a negative balance (overcommitment) of \$386,045. On a motion made by Greenwich Deputy Commissioner James Michael and seconded by Norwalk Assistant Principal Engineer Michael Yeosock, the TAG unanimously recommended approving the increase of the Brookfield US 202 Streetscape Phase 3 project from \$1,260,000 to \$1,360,000.


OTHER BUSINESS

RE: 2020 Safety Performance Measure Targets

Background: The 2020 Safety Targets memo provided to the TAG at the November meeting outlined the additional data WestCOG collected as a comparison to CTDOT's 2020 Numeric Target and to assist the MPO in understanding safety targets.

Following the establishment of State targets, MPOs have 180 days to either support CTDOT targets or establish other targets. CTDOT Safety Targets set in August 2019 are:

- Number of Fatalities: 5-year rolling average = 277
- Rate of Fatalities per 100 million Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT): 0.883
- Number of Serious Injuries: 5-year rolling average = 1,547
- Rate of Serious Injuries per 100 million VMT: 4.93
- Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities and Serious Injuries: 307

CTDOT Statement on Target Setting:

- 1. The mission of the Safety Program is to implement programs that reduce the number of injuries and fatalities on our Connecticut roadways. The purpose of setting and tracking these targets is to see the effectiveness of the State's initiatives and whether our programs are having an impact.
- 2. Federal requirements dictate that states must set realistic targets and achieve a certain number of them or penalties can be applied to specific highway safety funding.
- 3. Therefore, the Department cannot set targets that are not consistent with our most current data and trends.
- 4. As part of the data analysis, the Department reviews the following:
 - The five year moving average where we were
 - ➤ Where we are now
 - Use current data to forecast what can reasonably be expected to happen based on trend analysis

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) has a list of countermeasures that work:

This guide assists the Highway Safety Office in selecting effective, evidence-based countermeasures for traffic safety problem areas. These areas include:

- Impaired driving (alcohol and/or drugs)
- Occupant protection (seatbelts and child restraints)
- Speeding and aggressive driving
- Distracted Driving
- Drowsy Driving
- Motorcycle Safety training and awareness
- Young Drivers
- Bicycles and Pedestrians

The bottom line is that the Department conducts a trend analyses, establishes targets, administers effective federal countermeasures, and continuously evaluate the effectiveness of each initiative. The COGs' Regional Safety Plans will help identify, on a municipal level, high crash locations and assist in identifying problem identification and will help determine if infrastructure, behavioral education, and/or enforcement improvements are needed. All of these safety plans are living documents and the continuous reviews of these plans will allow stakeholders to identify what is working and what areas need improvement. "

Next Steps: Guidance from FHWA recommends that states must set realistic targets otherwise penalties can be issued to specific highway safety funding. Although the need for attainable short-term targets is understood, zero fatalities and serious injuries remain the long-term vision of the MPO Policy Boards. If HVMPO and SWRMPO establish their own targets, they then take on the responsibility of developing a methodology, reporting on targets, meeting the targets, and are held liable if the targets are not met. MPOs throughout CT are endorsing CTDOT's Targets. TAG members can consider recommending the MPO Policy Boards endorse resolutions supporting the 2020 State Targets.

WHEREAS the HVMPO may establish safety targets by agreeing to plan and program projects that contribute toward the accomplishment of the aforementioned State's targets, or establish its own target within 180 days of the State establishing and reporting its safety targets,
